## The Community

A progressive city, Carrington, North Dakota, with a population of 2,268, is known as the Central City because it is located within a 125-mile radius of North Dakota's four major cities: Bismarck, Fargo, Minot and Grand Forks.

The early economy of Carrington was founded on agriculture, and that tradition carries on today. The city is home to the state-of-the-art Dakota Growers Pasta Company, Central City Marketing and Processing, plus many more agribusinesses. Other major employers are Dakota Central Telecommunications, Northern Plains Electric Cooperative, Dakota Central Telecommunication, the North Dakota State University Research Center, the Garrison Diversion Headquarters and many financial institutions.

Health care is available from the up-to-date CHI/Carrington Health Center and Foster County Medical Center.

The city offers many recreational activities: a swimming pool, a bowling alley, outdoor volley/basketball and tennis courts, three softball complexes, a Frisbee golf course, a movie theater and a youth center.

The area also has whitetail deer hunting, duck/goose hunting, an annual gun show, shooting range/trap shooting and fishing. There are also biking trails, camping, hiking, horseback riding, snowmobiling and cross country skiing.

The beautiful 18-hole golf course, CrossRoads was completed in 2005 with a biking and hiking trail around it.
